




Putting Great Haywood on the map!

As well as all our regular activities for all ages in Great Haywood Memorial Hall (see our Facebook page), we have our special **Craft Fair between 10.00 and 3.00 on 12 May**, where local expert craftspeople will be selling unique wares from cakes to birdhouses and from jewellery to paintings and greetings cards - something for everyone (not forgetting the delicious refreshments!).

And we have an extra special Book Launch event on 22 June when local historian, David Robbie, will be signing copies of his book: Great Haywood, Past and Present, People and Places.



David has lived in Great Haywood for over 50 years and has worked on the book for many of those years.

It's a comprehensive history of the village, including Shugborough, from earliest times and provides a guided tour of the village today.

Then David has included biographies of the many interesting people who have lived in the village, including a detailed account of J. R. R. Tolkien's life in the area during the Great War. The final section talks about important buildings and places of interest.



About the Book:

Founded by Angles in the sixth century and recorded in the Domesday Book of 1086, Great Haywood, with its manor that included the adjacent estate of Shugborough and the ancient Forest of Cank, became an important political, religious and commercial centre in the Middle Ages.

It was involved in the tumultuous events surrounding the overthrow of Richard II in the 14th century, the Wars of the Roses of the 15th century, Tudor intrigues in the 16th century, the English Civil War of the 17th century, the Jacobite Rebellion of the 18th century, and the transport revolutions of the 18th and 19th centuries.

Great Haywood's location on four great highways of travel and trade has allowed it to witness the migration of early settlers, the passage of powerful kings and queens, large armies and rich merchants, as well as eminent travellers and writers. Situated on the important River Trent, it also enjoyed the golden age of coaching, was once one of the busiest canal junctions in England and saw the building of two important national railway lines.

It has been home to powerful nobles, influential politicians, fine artists and writers, a serial killer, Nazi war criminals and a large tropical reptile. And how many villages can boast of fascinating links with the Faerie Queene, the Holy Grail and The Lord of the Rings? Get your copy to find out more...

The book has 570 pages and 300 illustrations. The hardback costs £23.99, the paperback £17.99 and an Ebook at £3.50. There will also later be an Audiobook.

It will be in local bookshops, and also available from David himself at the launch event (*between 10.00am and 4.00pm on 22 June* in *Great Haywood Memorial Hall meeting room*), at other events to be organised later, or directly from him - daverobbie38@btinternet.com.

David is kindly sharing any profits among village organisations.



The distress that dogs cause by running loose can result in exhaustion, still births and injury. However, it is not just farm animals that can be affected by dogs that are not under control. Wild animals are just as susceptible.

We are now coming up to the time when fawns will be born and it coincides with warmer weather when more dog walkers will be out and about on Cannock Chase.



It is an offence under the Hunting Act 2004 to encourage or allow your dog to chase deer – even if they are not hunting. Seighford Airfield honoured with memorial

Distinguished West Midlands airfields Atcham, High Ercall and Seighford were honoured in April with the Airfields of Britain Conservation Trust's latest memorials.

As a result of long planning and co-operation between the Airfields of Britain Conservation Trust (ABCT) - the world's first national airfield charity - and various more local elements, three memorials were unveiled during Thursday to Saturday 11-13 April 2024 to commemorate Atcham, High Ercall and Seighford Airfields.

Atcham in Shropshire originally opened in August 1941 as a RAF fighter airfield, seeing several squadrons arrive, but became perhaps best remembered as home from June 1942 to the United States Army Air Force.

What eventually became known as the 495th Fighter Training Group provided invaluable advanced training for American pilots once they reached Britain, Republic P-47 fighters being primarily used. Once the Americans left after an exceptionally busy time here for Cheddington in Buckinghamshire in February 1945, Atcham saw further RAF use in other capacities before closing in October 1946. The technical site now forms Atcham Business Park but various traces of the airfield still remain, including one runway which now forms part of the B4394 road.

High Ercall in Telford and Wrekin was a major combined Maintenance Unit (MU), night fighter and training airfield during World War Two. Opened in October 1940, notable units based here included No 29 MU, which prepared and stored many aircraft for RAF use, No 68 Squadron with mostly Bristol Beaufighters and No 60 Operational Training Unit for advanced intruder instruction with de Havilland Mosquitoes.

After World War Two ended High Ercall's MU role predominated until the airfield closed in February 1964. A considerable part of the airfield, particularly the landing area, subsequently disappeared but this airfield has continued to play its part in the motor and road transport industry, both for training and commercial organisations, with many buildings such as large MU hangars still surviving.

Seighford during World War Two served as satellite airfield to Hixon, which has also indicated to ABCT it wishes to receive a memorial. Gradually opened during the summer of 1942, its main wartime user was No 30 Operational Training Unit which operated Vickers Wellingtons to instruct bomber crews.

Airspeed Oxford trainers of No 21 (Pilots) Advanced Flying Unit at Wheaton Aston later employed Seighford as a Relief Landing Ground until July 1946. Following a few years of inactivity, this airfield returned to use in 1956 for aircraft company Boulton Paul to maintain and modify English Electric Canberra bombers until the start of 1966.

Although now mainly a mixture of farming and industry, with many traces still evident, flying activity however still remains through the Staffordshire Gliding Club being present here since the 1990s.

All three memorials are of the main full-sized standardised design already widely utilised by ABCT https://www.abct.org.uk/airfield-markers/marker-programme/.

The charity's objective in this regard is to eventually commemorate each known major airfield in the United Kingdom with one of two forms of standardised granite memorial. Well over 200 have already been unveiled following huge national public demand for them - to clearly major effect, with hundreds more being planned.

Forest Live, the summer concert series presented by Forestry England, has announced that English musician and Supergrass frontman Gaz Coombes will support Johnny Marr and The Charlatans on **28 June 2024.**

Gaz Coombes first began making music at the age of 14, before forming renowned alternative rock band Supergrass in the early 90s.


