

Acton Trust To Spend £20,000 On Centre Improvements

The trustees of Acton Trussell, Bednall & Teddesley Hay Community Centre have agreed a budget of £20,000 for improvement works.

The car park has already been relined and three new bays for disabled drivers plus one for motorcycles created. At the rear of the building, the damaged concrete path has been replaced with smart tarmac giving safe access to the children's play area.

A height restriction barrier has been installed at the side of the Centre leading to the recreation ground to prevent unauthorised access. All the blue upholstered chairs have been cleaned and the front fence panels are to be repaired and repainted.

In coming months, new front doors are to be installed and plans are in hand to redecorate the foyer, main hall and meeting room.

A range of other works are also to be undertaken, including re-treating the main hall floor, repairing extractor fans, kitchen improvements and upgrading audio equipment.

A new ceiling-mounted projector and on-stage roll-down screen has been provided by the generosity of the BATTH Social Group with the support of Trust funding and this equipment will undoubtedly attract additional social and business use of "The Centre for All".

A year in the life of our Community Centre

Built for the benefit of our community, the Centre celebrated its 35th anniversary this year, since opening on 29 June 1990 and, as we approach 2026, we find ourselves not only looking ahead but reflecting on an eventful past year.

"The Centre for All" once again has had a busy twelve months, hosting some 600 functions from children's parties, club meetings and concerts to football matches, celebrations and all manner of social and business events.

It is satisfying to know that the Centre continues to play an important part in the life of our villages and hopefully will remain relevant and useful long into the future. The income from these lettings ensures the Centre's financial survival but it is the band of willing volunteers and club members that make it thrive and we thank them all for their time, skill and dedication.



The Main Hall proposal

2025 has also seen the trustees working long and hard to improve the Centre and the way it operates. Preparations are well advanced to convert the Trust to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, a structure which offers many benefits and creates long-term safeguards for the Centre; a range of health, safety and management measures have been introduced; property development, income generation and marketing plans with a new logo have been agreed and are being progressively implemented; Centre News is now produced and distributed to every home every two months;

Our new website is up and running, incorporating an online booking system, to be followed soon with a presence on Facebook; and it has been possible to allocate £20,000 towards improvements at the Centre, making it even more welcoming to even more people.

Such support and firm foundations give the Centre certainty and a continued relevance but it will always need additional, fresh individuals with new ideas and enthusiasm to constantly reinvigorate its purpose. 

The Wonderful World of Bees

At a recent meeting, members of Soroptimist International of Stafford welcomed David Teasdale as their Guest Speaker. David belongs to The North Staffordshire Bee Keepers and explained about the wonderful world of Bees.

Bees work at looking after their young and pollinating crops (e.g. The oil rape seed crop that increased its production by 60% because of pollination by Bees and insects)

Honey Bees live in Hives with about 50,000 in each colony, consisting of The Queen Bee, hundreds of Drones (male) and thousands of Worker Bees (female)

The Hive has cells, made from wax secreted by the Worker Bees, where the Queen lays her eggs (*The Queen can lay 5,000 eggs in one day*)

When the larvae hatch they are fed by The Worker Bees with pollen and nectar. Worker Bees must visit over 4,000 flowers to make just one tablespoon of Honey.

The Bee Keepers collect the Honey from the Hive by hand, so that the Bees are not harmed, the Bees are then fed with sugar syrup to replace the Honey.

Honey is made when the Bees ingest nectar, process it and then store the substance in the honeycombs. Bees wax is used for candle making, water proofing, polish, soap and cosmetics.

Brocton WI Meetings

"It's all about colour!" Joanne Massey explained at our September meeting. During her presentation she told us of her passion for all things 1950s, which began as a teenager as a result of "Becoming fascinated with old movies."

This passion deepened and developed, after meeting her husband Keith, when they both decided to create their perfect 1950s home, in which they could live their 1950s lifestyle - a perfect retreat from the twenty-first century.

She took us through their journey in creating their authentic home, from travelling up and down the country in search of the perfect vintage piece, to even importing furniture from France. Their attention to detail in creating their retro dream is truly amazing. From bakerlite switches and sockets, formica worktops and eye level grill to a bespoke hall carpet - with its colourful geometric swirls.

Joanne's entertaining talk provided us all with a chance to escape the humdrum of modern day living, as well as encouraging us to let a little more colour into our everyday lives!

Then at our October presentation - 'A Serving Ghurkha', was presented by a long serving member of the regiment, who had followed in the footsteps of his grandfather and uncle. His talk explored the history, recruitment process and everyday life of a serving Ghurkha in the British Army, based in Stafford.



The Ghurkha army began in the early 1800s when the King of Ghurkha united a number of small kingdoms to create Nepal, which was protected by a new army named after him - the Ghurkhas. A peace treaty was signed in 1815 between the King of Nepal and the East India Company. Part of this treaty allowed the company to

recruit young Nepalese men into the East India Company's army. This continued when India became part of the British Empire and later after India was partitioned, four regiments were incorporated into the British Army.

Each year 30,000 applications are received from young Nepalese men for the much coveted 250 places within the British Army's Ghurkha regiments. Each eventual recruit is expected to complete a number of gruelling physical and mental tasks including carrying 15Kg for 25Km. This is slightly easier than the previous task which was to carry 35Kg uphill for 2.5 miles! Once selected the recruits move to the UK, where they spend nine moths in training. During this time they learn English and study UK culture including how to order a pint of beer in a pub. When they have finished their training they are ready to join one of the Ghurkha regiments based throughout the UK including the Signals based in Stafford.

This interesting and informative talk allowed us time to reflect on the bravery of the Ghurkhas, as well as the important role they play within the British Army and, as we approach Remembrance Sunday, it provided a fitting opportunity to remember those that have fallen in past wars.

It was a lovely day on the Saturday morning 13th September for Ride and Stride, but got rather rainy later on!


Well done to all the cyclists who got involved, especially our loyal local supporters.


